Advancement	Is it working for your unit? How do you keep the records and report advancements to the Council? How do you keep the boys moving forward and how fast?
Blue & Gold	How to have the best Cub Scout birthday ever with themes, decorations, ceremonies and more! This class covers planning, organizing, and presentation.
Campfires	Learn fire safety, how to set up and light up your campfires. Learn the ancient art of making flint fire starters.

Cub Scout Cooking	Tips, techniques and recipes for making outdoor cooking something to remember. Hands-on activity.
Cub Scout Crafts	Resources for ideas and craft materials. Learn fun and easy crafts for all ranks that help them to complete their requirements.
Cub Scout Outings	Feel overwhelmed about planning a campout or just a simple outing for a den or a whole pack? We will make it easy, and break it down into steps for you to follow. Where to go, what to do, and how to do it. Boys like to get outside. Take them! Your outing may just be your den's or pack's favorite part of Cub Scouting!
Cub Scout Parents	Do you need more parental involvement? Are your existing leaders overworked? Do your "new" parents seem reluctant to volunteer? The "Scout Parents" program is for you! We will show you how to get your parents involved in the scouting program. When parents understand scouting, have duties that fit their talents, and know what is happening in the unit everyone benefits!
Cub Scout Slides	Come learn how to make fun, creative neckerchief slides that will have your boys wanting more!
Derbys	Plan 'em, build 'em, run 'em, score 'em and make 'em a super addition to your program. (Pinewood, Space and Regatta)
Dutch Oven Cooking	Learn how to use and take care of a Dutch oven. Participants will learn how to make great food.
Duty to God	Plan a worship service, learn about religious emblems, and practice "A Scout is Reverent."
Eagle Advising	Help your Life Scouts with their project selection their Eagle application and preparation for their Board of Review. Teach them the etiquette of becoming an Eagle.
Emergency Preparedness	We pray it never happens but you have to be prepared when it does. Here is how.
Flag Etiquette	Flag procedures including proper saluting, raising, lowering, and much more in this "Respect for the Flag"-oriented session. Also, knowing the U.S. Flag Code helps when staging courts of honor--an important event for Scouts.
Fundraising	Popcorn, car washes, selling candy and wreaths. How do you finance your troop's activities? This session will help you find new ways and the right ways to finance the fun and business of an active unit.
Games & Activities	Indoor, outdoor, fast, slow, physical and mental. Let the games begin! Fun for all!
Geocaching to Promote Scouting	GPS technology and the sport of "geocaching" (a treasure hunt using a GPS unit to find a prize) are both popular with older Scouts. Learn how to incorporate geocaching activities into your unit or district to promote recruitment, advancement, retention and public relations. This session will focus on GPS-based activities for older Scouts (age 11+). (2-hour course; inside and outside activities)
Grossology	Learn how to make science fun, interesting and sometimes edible at the den/pack level.
Health & Safety	Learn how to maintain the health and safety of your Scouts from meetings to outings.
High adventure in Yucca Council	Need ideas on fun and interesting places within Yucca Council? This is the place to be!

Information will also be provided on how you can become a certified LNT Trainer or LNT Master Educator. Learn to enjoy the outdoor experience while preserving the environment.
Orienteering Course	How to set up an Orienteering Course – Using Map & Compass.
Pizzazz	Learn how to add pizzazz into your Pack and Den meetings. Have your boys (and parents) wanting more!
Pack Meetings	Learn how to plan FUN and effective Pack meetings.
Realistic First Aid	Spice up your first aid training by using realistic scenarios.
Recognition & Special Awards	There are many awards available to Scouts that are beyond the handbook – Texas badge, recruiter strip, helmet safety badge, interpreter strips, and much, much more! Also, creative and easy ways to let those hard-working adults know they are appreciated!
Recruiting	Successful packs make recruiting new Cubs a year-round process. Learn how to recruit all year long and to make the most out of your recruiting events.
Safe Cycling	Learn how to teach boys safe cycling. Learn what a rider needs and where they can go.
Safe Scouting	Never hear "Coulda, Woulda, Shoulda" again. Now you will know BSA's rules about camping, cooking, swimming, tour permits, and more. Everything you need to know to be safe in scouting.
Scouting with Disabilities	Scouting gives each boy a chance regardless of his physical or mental abilities. Learn about the program that is there for those boys who are challenged. Learn to recognize these boys' strengths and difficulties, adapt your methods to work with them, and adjust your programs to enrich the Scouting experience for all your Scouts. This training focuses on explaining these characteristics, demonstrating the challenges and opportunities they provide for Scout leaders, helping them develop strategies for supporting Scouts with physical, mental or emotional challenges so that they feel successful in the Scouting program (without sacrificing the integrity of the entire unit). This course will provide information on how to certify Scouts for Alternative rank advancement requirements and merit badges.
Scout Masters' Minute	This session is for everyone who wants to better understand the power of a Scoutmaster's Minute. Learn how to make this minute work for you and your troop.
Scout Parents	Scout Parents Unit Coordinator. Find out what this position is and how to use it in your troop.
