DERBY CHAIRMAN

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Tiger Trail Events

- Three Legged Snowshoe Race- Tiger Cubs and adult partners race as a team.
- Snow Tunnels- Adult partners direct blindfolded Tiger Cubs through buried tires.
- Snowball Challenge- Tiger Cubs and adult partners throw snowballs (knotted cloth) at targets.
- Tiger Sled Race- Adult partners pull Tiger Cubs on plastic saucer through marked course.
- Bobcat Gold Rush- Tiger Cubs sift for gold nuggets.
- Tiger Cub Log Haul- distance to be determined on site
- Tiger Cub Baton Relay- distance to be determined on site

Cub (Wolf & Bear) Trail Events

- Log Haul- Cubs will move logs to the top of the hill and then move them back down and stack them.
- Gold Mining- Cubs will sift through containers of sand in search of gold nuggets.
- Snow Tunnels- Cubs work their way through a marked course wearing snow shoes.
- Snowshoe Challenge- Cubs work their way through a marked course wearing snow shoes.
- Beaver Trap- Cubs test their throwing skills by throwing from between their legs like a football center, trying to snag beavers in a trap.
- Blizzard- Cubs follow a guide rope through a zigzag course which blindfolded.
- Compass Work- Cubs move themselves and their gear over river using a very narrow bridge.
- Ski Challenge- Cubs use two-man skis to negotiate a marked course.
- Golden Staircase- Cubs use skill and teamwork to move supplies to the top of the hill.
- Bears-vs-Wolves- Baton Relay- distance to be determined on site
- Bears & Wolves First Aid Readyman Skill- be prepared for any skill

Webelos Trail Events

- Jack London's Matches- (Outdoorsman) You have been on the trail for the better part of the day. You're tired, you're wet, and you're hungry. Build and light a fire sufficient to heat your tin can stove and cook a single flapjack.
- Polar Bear Hunt- (Craftsman) Rations are getting low and your only choice is to follow the tracks in the snow. Your only weapon is a homemade spear. Be careful! You may have only one shot.
- Smooshboard Race- Patrol is timed in walking a marked course.
- Crevasse Rescue- (Outdoorsman and Readyman) One of your patrol has fallen down an icy crevasse. Using your rappelling gear and rescue equipment, you descend into the crevasse. Once you have determined the injuries sustained in the fall, use proper first aid to bring your friend out.
- Striking It- Too many hours around the campfire? Time for some fun, you say? With great skill, patience and determination, see how many match heads you can light with your handy dandy axe.
- Searching for Pay Dirt- (Geologist) Using a compass, the boys must navigate a course to find rocks in designated areas. The three types of rocks are igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary.
- Crossing the Great Abyss- Working as a team, each patrol must use their imagination and initiative to cross to the other side.
- Kiss of the North- (Readyman) Patrols move through three stations in order to answer questions pertaining to hypothermia. The patrol earns the pieces necessary to build a stretcher and carry a patrol member back to the start.
- Webelos I- Baton Relay- distance to be determined on site
- Webelos II- Baton Relay- distance to be determined on site
- Winners Relay- Webelos I & Webelos II winners compete.
- Great Snow Trek- This event is an obstacle course that requires dodging, crawling, balancing and jumping.
- Assayer- This is the end of the Klondike Trail where you turn in your score cards to determine how you did and if the trip through the Klondike was worth it.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Klondike Committee invites any and all Webelos, Cub, and Tiger Scouts to come out to the White Sands National Monument and join in a day of fun in the 'snow'.

PATCHES	A distinctive patch has been designed and each person Who registers will receive the patch. We have made a large order for patches, but patches will be guaranteed only to preregistered groups.
CONCESSIONS	The Gila Lodge, Order of the Arrow, will be open all day, serving hot dogs, hamburgers, sodas, and chips.
PARKING	Ample parking is available, but carpooling is advised. Families are encouraged to visit.
AWARDS	1 st , 2d, and 3d place awards will be presented for each event on each of the three trails (On Cub Trail, Wolves and Bears will earn awards separately), as well as the Webelos Sled Race.

PRIOR REGISTRATION IS A MUST!!!

Registration with monies must be received **NO LATER THAN 15 February 2009**. Registration forms will not be taken on the day of the event. If you have more Tigers/Cubs/Webelos at the time of check-in than were listed on the registration form, they will be added to your registration. This is necessary so we will know how many units will be in attendance and have a rough count of the number of Scouts/Scouters who will be in attendance.

Den size is six (6) Scouts. If you have less than 6 Scouts, some Scouts may have to compete twice at an event. If you have more than 6 Scouts, some Scouts will have to sit out an event. If this is the case, make sure you rotate your Scouts at each of the stations so everyone can participate equally.

During registration dens with Wolf rank and Bear rank will mix to compete in the Bear rank. Dens registering with Webelos I and Webelos II will compete as Webelos II.

PLAN FOR A HOT LUNCH – Bring your own lunch or dine at the Order of the Arrow food tent and enjoy delicious hamburgers, hot dogs, soda, and chips.

SUGGESTED CLOTHING – Be prepared for wet or dry weather with temperatures ranging from 40° to 70 °. The following is a suggested clothing list for cooler weather.

1. Cap with ear flaps
2. Gloves (Good for Webelos in sled race)
3. Extra pair of pants
4. Long underwear or PJs
5. Sweater or sweatshirt
6. Sun Screen

Layering of clothing is better than a heavy coat.

Tennis shoes can be worn.

1. Sled with box to hold equipment.

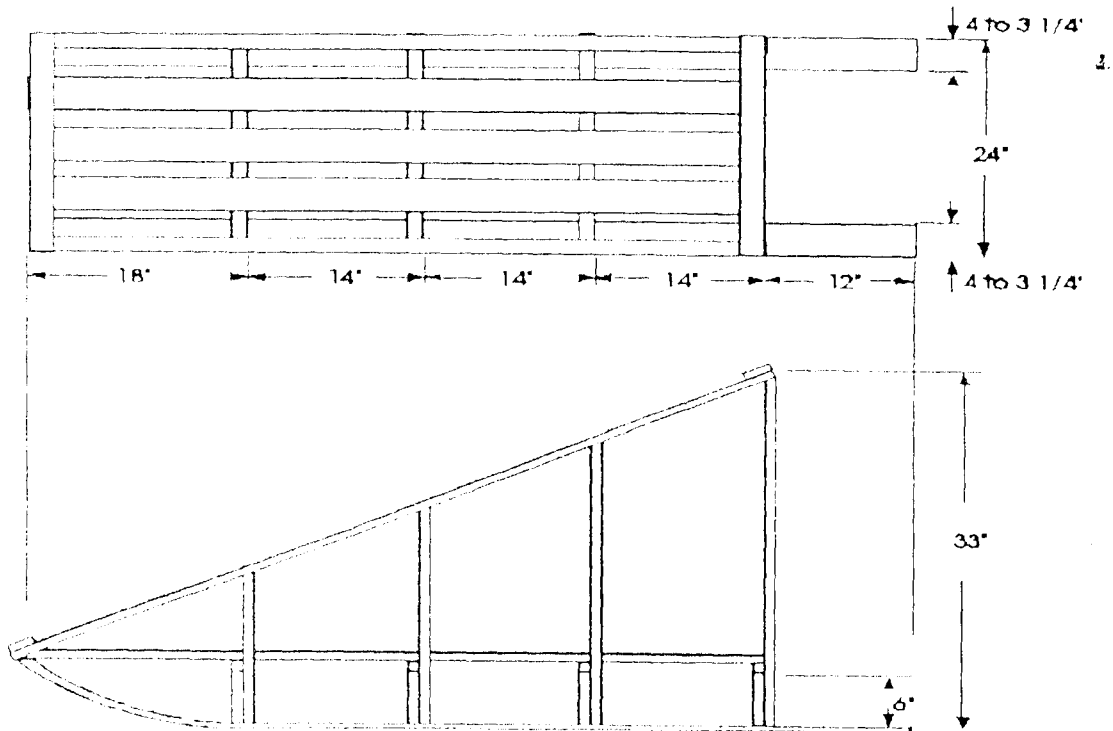
25 ft. length of rope (clothesline or equivalent)

2. Sleds will be judged prior to the Dens being allowed on the Webelos Trail. They will be graded 1st, 2d, and 3d.

KLONDIKE SLED PLAN

This sketch is just a suggestion, use your imagination. You may add any colorful decorations and make minor changes as you wish. Runners must be at least 3 1/4 inches wide and NOT CLAD WITH METAL.

FOR SAFETY REASONS, ONLY WOODEN RUNNERS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE SLEDS!!

6 pcs	1 in. x 1 in. x 18 in.	Cross support
4 pcs	1/2 in. x 4 in. x 5 ft.	Floor Cover
8 pcs	1 in. x 2 in. x 6 in.	Upright support
2 pcs	1 in. x 2 in. x 40 in.	Rear upright
2 pcs	1 in. x 2 in. x 38 in.	2 nd Rear upright
2 pcs	1 in. x 2 in. x 26 in.	2 nd Front upright
2 pcs	1 in. x 2 in. x 12 in.	Front Support
2 pcs	1/2 in. x 2 in. x 6 ft.	Hand rail
1 pc	1/2 x 2 in. x 30 in.	Front curve guard
1 pc	2 in. x 2 in. x 18 in.	Tow bar

Sled length - Approximately 72 inches.
Sled height - Approximately 33 inches**

IMPORTANT THINGS FOR EVERYONE TO REMEMBER

Scout spirit, teamwork, Den flags and Den yells influence scoring significantly. The more of each, the better the Den score.

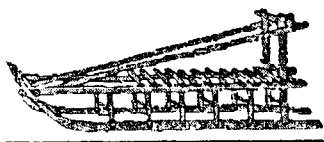
No one will have extra clothes or equipment to loan you should yours get wet. Take a few precautions before you leave to stay warm and dry. If you have questions, get answers to those questions before you leave home. Keep an extra set of clothes in the car just in case; it is good insurance.

Bring a compass to the Derby and know how to use it in a general fashion.

Please pay attention to the warning signs that you will see along with the YELLOW warning tape. These are placed to protect the environment within White Sands National Monument,

IMPORTANT THINGS FOR WEBELOS TO REMEMBER

No loops in the "pull" rope for the sleds. Pulling grips can be tied but not large enough for hands to be put into. Several Webelos were hurt in previous Klondike Derbies when they had their hands in the pre-tied loops and lost their footing and fell down and were dragged, and when they did finally release themselves, the sled ran over them.
