HISTORY

The first charter application on file in the Scout Office is dated August 1918, and covers a report of activity during the year 1917. The Council was composed of El Paso County only and there were 8 troops registered at that time. Mr. Glenn O. Everyman was the first Scout Executive. He served as Scout Executive until January 1923. When he left, the Council included Dona Ana County, El Paso County and two Mormon Colonies in Mexico - Colonia Juarez and Colonia Dublan. At the close of 1922 there were 35 troops of 673 scouts in the Council; of these there were 31 troops in the City of El Paso with 523 Scouts.

FACTS, FIGURES & FUNDING

The Yucca Council proudly serves El Paso, Hudspeth, Dona Ana, Otero, Sierra, Grant and Luna counties in West Texas and Southern New Mexico. The Yucca Council serves nearly 7,000 members, which includes over 4,500 youth and 2,500 adults, in 230 youth programs. To support Scouting's growth in 2016, the Yucca Council raised more than \$900,000 through Friends of Scouting, Popcorn Sales, Special Events, Scouting Activities and Foundations and Grants.

COUNCIL PROPERTIES

The Yucca Council operates two camping properties - Camp Dale Resler (Cloudcroft, NM) & Camp Pioneer (Sunland Park, NM). Both camps offer year-round camping opportunities for Scouts and also serve as host sites for District and Council activities. Together, these properties encompass more than 200 acres of high mountain and desert terrain for varied Scouting activities.



Programs of the Yucca Council



Cub Scouting

A family- and home-centered program for boys in the first through fifth grade (or 7, 8, 9, and 10 years old). Cub Scouting's emphasis is on a quality program at the local level, where the most boys and families are involved. Fourth- and fifth-grade (or 10-year-old) boys are called **Webelos (WE'll BELOYal Scouts)** and participate in more advanced activities that begin to prepare them to become Boy Scouts.



Boy Scouting

A year-round program for boys age 11 – 17 that provides fun outdoor activities, peer group leadership opportunities, and a personal exploration of career, hobby and special interests. The program is designed to achieve the Boy Scouts of America's objectives of strengthening character, personal fitness and good citizenship.



Varsity Scouting

An active, exciting program for young men (ages 14 to 17) built around five program fields of emphasis: advancement, high adventure, personal development, service, and special programs and events. A youth member, called a program manager, is responsible for each of the five fields of emphasis and works with an adult member, called a program adviser, from the team committee to coordinate each phase of the program.



Venturing

A program for young men and women (ages 14 to 20) that includes challenging high-adventure activities, sports, and hobbies for teenagers that teach leadership skills, provide opportunities to teach others, and give them an opportunity to learn and grow in a supporting, caring, and fun environment.



ScoutReach – “Unidos Prosperamos”

ScoutReach is the Boy Scouts of America's commitment to ensuring all young people have an opportunity to join Scouting, regardless of their circumstances, neighborhood, or ethnic background. Locally, the Unidos Prosperamos initiative gives special leadership and emphasis to urban and rural Scouting programs.



Learning for Life

Learning for Life offers seven school-based programs that focus on character development and career education to help youth develop social and life skills, assist them with character and career development, and foster positive personal values to prepare them to make ethical decisions that will enable them achieve their full potential. **Exploring** is Learning for Life's career education program for young men and women who are 11 through 20 years old. Its purpose is to provide experiences to help young people mature and to prepare them to become responsible and caring adults.
